- **Adult Programs:** Ohio Medicaid offers a span of programs for older adults and people with disabilities to assist with medical expenses. These programs provide health care coverage consisting of primary and acute-care benefit packages along with long-term care.
- **Programs for Children:** Ohio Healthy Families Health care coverage program for families that include a child younger than 19 and who meet income requirements.
- **Medication Programs:** Ohio's Best Rx Prescription drug discount card program for seniors and low-income individuals.
- **Additional Programs:** Working Ohioans with disabilities may be interested in the Medicaid Buy-In for Workers with Disabilities program.
